International Travelers needed for a BCG TB vaccine study

➤ Healthcare or Public Health workers traveling to a TB-endemic country for a minimum of 10 days and no longer than 6 months

BCG TIPI STUDY

Researchers are evaluating whether pre-travel investigational BCG immunization can prevent infections in an "at-risk" traveler population traveling to countries with a moderate and high burden of TB where there is a risk for multidrug resistant and extensively drug-resistant TB exposure. Information collected may provide valuable information to further describe and identify exposure/risk factors for infection as well as any information regarding development of active TB disease, and the efficacy of BCG vaccine to prevent symptomatic all-cause respiratory infections during travel abroad.

You may be eligible if:

- ♦ Between 18 and 65 years of age
- ♦ In good health and HIV negative
- ♦ Have not received BCG vaccine
- ♦ Never had TB infection before
- ◆ Planning travel to country with high moderate TB rate
- ♦ Not pregnant or lactating

Study procedures include:

- ♦ In-person visits (4-6) at the study site
- ♦ General health screening
- ♦ Blood draws (2 up to 4)
- ♦ BCG vaccination or placebo
- ♦ Study diary & questionnaires completion
- ◆ Compensation will be provided for study visits completed (about \$150/completed study visit)
